Youth Outcomes Battery

YOB Introduction

From Overview of the ACA Youth Outcomes Battery V2

The second edition of the ACA Youth Outcomes Battery (ACA-YOB) provides camps and other youth programs with measures that focus on eleven common youth outcomes. The statistically tested scales are age-appropriate, short and concise, easily administered tools that can be individualized to a camp, afterschool program, or other youth programs. While the battery was designed with the camp setting in mind (e.g., nature-based context, residential nature, small group living, youth focused) the measures are focused on strong youth development outcomes that are not predicated on particular settings.

The YOB can help camp and youth program staff:

- Evaluate program goals
- Document the changes in your youth so that information can be shared with key stake-holders (parents, funders, staff, etc.)
- Demonstrate your commitment to quality programs that make a difference in people's lives
- Meet expectations for trust-worthy instruments (high reliability and validity statistical checks prove the scales accuracy)
- Can be combined to measure socially relevant concepts (Ex. Environmental Leadership could be measured by combining the scales for teamwork, responsibility, independence, problem-solving, and affinity for nature)

Specific Youth Outcomes Measured by the YOB

The YOB focuses on eleven outcomes common to many camps and other youth development programs.

- Friendship Skills (i.e., make friends and maintain relationships)
- Independence (i.e., rely less on adults and other people for solving problems and for their day-to-day activities)
- Teamwork (i.e., become more effective when working in groups of their peers)
- Family Citizenship (i.e., encourage attributes important to being a member of a family)
- Perceived Competence (i.e., believe that they can be successful in the things they do)
- Interest in Exploration (i.e., be more curious, inquisitive, eager to learn new things)
- Responsibility (i.e., learn to be accountable for their own actions and mistakes)
- Affinity for Nature (i.e., feelings of emotional attraction toward nature)
- Problem-Solving Confidence (i.e., believe they have abilities to resolve problems)
- Camp Connectedness (i.e., feeling welcomed and supported at camp)
- Spiritual Well-Being (i.e., having purpose and meaning in life, transcendence)

Young Camper Survey

Five Year Comparison

- Satisfaction with American Heritage has decreased quite a bit from not only 2015-2016, but also from 2012-2016
- Satisfaction for World Friendship is also historically lower than the other sessions, but has increased significantly in 2016
- Satisfaction for Knighthood I and II are pretty stable and high from year to year with only some minor flux overall

Recommendations

 Definitely continue to assess the satisfaction of campers with their specific session experiences seeing as there has been relatively less satisfaction with young campers from American Heritage and World Friendship (But then again, what else would you do for this groups since the outcomes are rather simplistic in nature)

Older Camper Outcomes Basic Version

Average Scores by Outcome

- General overall decrease in average outcomes from 2015-2016
- Still falling generally at least marginally higher than the normative numbers provided by ACA
- Friendship is the only one that is extremely consistent

Friendship

- Relatively stable: little change from year to year
- Declined more drastically from 2015-2016 in American Heritage
- Increased more significantly from 2015-2016 in Knighthood II

Independence

- Overall has decreased from the numbers seen in 2015 for American Heritage, Knighthood I, and World Friendship
- Increased more for Knighthood II, but this seems insignificant when all others have decreased

Teamwork

• Also, overall decreases in all sessions excepting Knighthood II

Perceived Competence

• Again, decreases at least marginally across the board except in Knighthood II

Responsibility

• Again, the same increase and decrease pattern split between Knighthood II increasing and the other three decreasing

Affinity for Nature

- Decreases in the numbers from American Heritage, Knighthood I, and World Friendship
- Knighthood II remaining somewhat static overall

Camp Connectedness

• Same general trends between the sessions with World Friendship as an exception remaining relatively stable

Satisfaction Results

- Significant drop in satisfaction for American Heritage and Knighthood I
- Significant increase in satisfaction for Knighthood II and World Friendship
- Overall for American Heritage, it seems that one of the primary causes for being unsatisfied was the stomach bug

Older Camper Outcomes Detailed Version

Average Scores by Outcome

- Outcomes seem to have remained either stable or increased at least marginally for each outcome from 2015-2016
- American Heritage and World friendship scoring again the lowest out of the four sessions

Friendship

- Fluctuation from session to session in status and change with an increase building from American Heritage to Knighthood II and then a decrease at the World Friendship mark
- Increase in overall change along with an increased number of years at camp

Independence

- Remained pretty much the same from session to session with a growth in change from American Heritage through Knighthood II and then a drop in World Friendship
- Increased recognized change correlated with an increased number of years at camp

Teamwork

- Slight increase from American Heritage to Knighthood I, but then a decrease and stabilization from Knighthood II to World Friendship
- Increase overall in recognized change the longer that the children have been coming to camp

Perceived Competence

- Generally increasing from American Heritage to Knighthood II with then a slight decrease in World Friendship
- Again, a correlation with the increase in recognized change and an increase in summers spent at camp

Interest in Exploration and Change

• Remained relatively stable in both status and growth

Responsibility

• General increase and stability from American Heritage to Knighthood II with a decrease again in World Friendship

• Again, a correlation between an increased number of years at camp and an increased acknowledgement of change in this area

Affinity for Nature

- Pretty stable with a slight increase from Knighthood II to World Friendship
- Again, a correlation between an increased number of years at camp and an increased acknowledgement of change in this area

Satisfaction Results

- Satisfaction has grown at least slightly for American Heritage, Knighthood I, and Knighthood II while there is a decrease in satisfaction with World Friendship
- From 2015-2016, satisfaction for American heritage has decreased
- From 2015-2016, satisfaction for Knighthood I has remained relatively stable (very slight increase)
- From 2015-2016, satisfaction for Knighthood II has increased
- From 2015-2016, satisfaction for World Friendship has remained the same
- Kids getting incredibly sick seems to be one of the most common comments that may be contributing in the drop in satisfaction for American Heritage in Particular
- World Friendship satisfaction may be due to the exhaustion that comes at the end of the summer. Some campers commented that there were not enough activities etc.

Overall Recommendations

- Collect data on the following outcomes every few years rather than every year (They are all relatively stable and do not denote big enough changes):
 - o Friendship
 - o Affinity to Nature
 - o Interest in Exploration
- One thing I noticed that significantly impacted the satisfaction with camp from the side of campers was the event of severe illness, which happened last year in American Heritage. It seems that in other years without such a sickness sweeping through camp, satisfaction with this session was much higher, so it will be interesting to see a comparison between this summer and last summer assuming we don't get hit with a crazy stomach bug again.
 - Another note here was that some oldest campers felt they didn't learn enough or as much as they had in the past about American history or Native American culture during this session.
 Perhaps inserting something in the morning as we do for Knighthood sessions in the form of story time and World Friendship in the form of news could help increase satisfaction in this area (Molly and I have been talking a little bit about this)
- With World Friendship it seemed like there were more comments surrounding the food provided that may have impacted satisfaction with the session. I know that energy generally is at a low during this session, so that is likely also an explanation for this very slight drop.







Average Scores by Session - 2019






Average Score - 5 Year Comparitive












Average of Friendship by Sesssion









Average of Independence by Sesssion









Average of Teamwork by Sesssion









Average of Perceived Competence by Sesssion









Average of Responsibility by Sesssion









Average of Affinity for Nature by Sesssion









Outcome Yearly Trends - Basic Older Camper














Average "Status" by Outcome






Friendship Change & Status by Session






Independence Change & Status by Session








Teamwork Change & Status by Session




Perceived Competence (2017)






Perceived Competence Change & Status by Session






Interest in Exploration Change & Status by Session






Responsibility Change & Status by Session




Affinity for Nature (2018)






Affinity for Nature Change & Status by Session






Satisfaction 5 Year Analysis












So, when at pick up he reported he yet again didn't progress in rank, and we read the note written to him, we were sorry for this GG experience because it's tainted an otherwise wonderful childhood memory.

Here are the things my kids offered as critiques: 1) They needed more counselor sensitivity to bathroom breaks. Overall, for new campers, in particular, it's not always easy to ask for a bathroom break or to know when is appropriate to go to the bathroom. And not all kids are comfortable asking. Bathroom procedures should be discussed and outlined right from the get-go. It was not emphasized as it needed to be,

at least from my girls' perspective. 2) My girls both had the biggest problem with being forced to eat foods that they know they dislike and do not eat at home. I think making kids drink water at the top of the meal is key. But if a kid knows they don't like a particular food, no counselor should get in a power struggle with a kid over eating eggs. Food pressure is just not a good thing, particularly if it's clear that a kid is eating at meals. For one of my girls, a few days started off pretty miserably because of this. 3) My girls said they always seemed to feel rushed. And I thought this was an interesting piece of feedback.


Campership & Tuition Assistance Dollars by Session

Veteran vs New Demographic

























What were your campers' favorite activities and areas this summer? What did they enjoy most about them?

My younger campers all really enjoyed barn, crafts, and ropes. They loved the fact that they did something different every time that they went, instead of the same activity each time. My older campers really enjoyed barn, crafts, pool, and radio. They got to do lots of different activities at these areas, but also got to chill and connect with their friends when they wanted to.

All of my younger campers loved barn, pool and ropes. While my older campers preferred more free form areas like crafts, Alchemy and radio.

My campers loved Pool, Store, G-Smash, and Archery. What most of them enjoyed about all those areas except G-smash was the amount of time to just sit and talk to counselors and friends. G-smash is a cool place for kids to role play or "experience" knightly combat as many kids, including myself, have thought about since we were little.

My campers most enjoyed Barn, WILD, Ropes, and Magicology. My youngest campers were enthralled with the magicology program. We interacted with it constantly outside of being at the area and I really helped them to explore the outdoors. My campers of all ages LOVED barn, but I think specifically my oldest campers loved barn, WILD, and ropes because they got to do physical activity and be outside.

My campers love pool, barn, and store - they loved that there was something that held their attention for the whole period.

Store. Kids love candy

Middlers still consistently enjoy BBâ€[™]s and most of the time archery, which is awesome. Radio and ropes seemed to be very popular among my older campers as good "long stretch― things to do in both afternoons& mornings.

Open space trips= always loved by all senior ages

My campers' favorite areas were consistently Archery, Rifles, Pool, Barn, and WILD. Archery, Rifles and Barn seem to be most enjoyed because a lot of campers don't have access to those activities at home, which makes them fun and exciting. Pool is well-liked because it's very laid back, and provides time for the campers to hang out without much structure other than being in the pool. WILD was popular because it provided an opportunity for the campers who were into hiking to enjoy that interest, and also allows for the exploration of camp's property.

My campers loved ropes, barn, magicology, store and pool. They loved ropes and barn because each time they went they were able to accomplish a goal or do something that was out of the ordinary. Pool was always a blast and magicology was a way for them to be silly and creative.

My younger campers favorite activities were BBs, store, ropes, pool, barn, and magicology. They most enjoyed doing things that they might not do often at home, like shooting BB guns, eating a ton of candy, and playing outside in the forest. My older campers enjoyed pool, radio, G-Smash, sports, barn, and open-space trips. I did not have campers this summer, but from what I heard from campers out and about, they really enjoyed the cooking clinics and the special clinics that counselors put on. They really liked how spontaneous they were, and the fact that they got to do it with their friends.

WILD, Store, Archery, Pool, Open Space Trips. They loved bonding with friends and staff members.

During check in barn was almost always in the list of things that thy were most excited about for the session. Pool was always an area that they could have endless fun, many of the girls also loved being able to get clean at pool.

Since i was on crew lâ€[™]m not exactly sure but I noticed that campers enjoyed the barn and hearing about the stories of the horses.

Noticed that younger kids especially loved being around the new barn, even if that meant not riding horses. A lot of my campers this summer really enjoyed hiking, especially when it was not scheduled, but was done more as a dorm bonding activity.

They really liked barn because of the horses and ropes. They liked crafts because they just wanted to chill.

What were your campers' least favorite activities & areas this summer? How can they be improved to be more fun and relevant to their needs and interests?

My younger campers got very tired of BBs and archery, just because it was the same repeated activity every day. Same for the seniors with rifles and archery. I think these are great areas that a lot of kids enjoyed, but they could be improved to be more fun if the people running the area tried to incorporate more special programming with it like themes or prizes or something like that. Just to keep the kids interested each time they go.

This summer lacked special activities compared to past summers where there was a good mix of core programming and special activities.

I feel like I never had a boy say they wanted to go to Alchemy. I don't totally know what the reason for that is (outside of Knighthood), but I would guess that it is because most of the programming revolves around skin products or lip balms and things that most boys don't have any desire for.

My youngest campers liked BBs the least. I think they just didn't enjoy having to wait long periods of time before they got to shoot and many of them didn't enjoy the idea of shooting guns anyway. My oldest campers all really had their own preferences.

My campers really dislikes Alchemy and BB's (lots of sitting around - counselors must entertain and if counselors are lazy they get bored). Sports too is difficult because some kids feel ostracized for feeling the lack of athletic ability being called out.

Crafts. A lot of my boys just don't like it.

I would say store has become less cherished probably due to its frequency on schedules but still is enjoyed. Crafts and wild were less popular with my campers- this is often due to demographics/ interests.

There is usually one or two campers at any given activity who aren't into whatever the area is, either consistently at that area or depending on the day. There were no areas that I observed resounding boredom with. I think every camper has activities they prefer or dislike, but I don't have any outstanding examples of programming that I think needs to be improved to maximize camper involvement.

The girls did not enjoy BB's. I think that the people running the area should have had more special programing like using balloons or maybe different ways to decorate the targets.

I think for the most part the least favorite activity for my boys was crafts because their attention spans and the ability to actually get into what they were doing just didn't really fit well into what they would like to do. My J/M campers didn't like WILD, because a lot of them didn't like hiking. I think its helpful to give them things to think about/look at while hiking. They also didn't like that BBs was a lot of waiting around to shoot once. If there was a way to split up sister cabins and brother dorms for BBs, that could really add to the enjoyment of it.

BBs. They wouldn't like the aspect of waiting to shoot even if we had a game going while waiting.

My campers didn't have least favorites, I think they enjoyed most every activity. They sometimes got bored at jr middler wild.

They didn't look forward to areas such as Crafts and J/M Video

The kids that I sat with this summer never had a high interest in crafts. I think that sometimes the younger kids especially the older junior middlers did not enjoy having to do the same thing as everyone else.

Crafts, when i had my junior/middlers, they often times didn't have a set activity causing it to be unorganized and it seemed to not be as enjoyable for the boys as it could be. BBs also would tend to be a struggle just do to how long it took for them to get their turn to shoot. They didnt have anything to do while they waited. G-smash, BB's

A lot of my younger campers didn't like sports but I think its just difficult to choose a sport to play that all campers (boys and girls) will be happy with.

Both my oldest and youngest campers didn't particularly like waiting in line for archery, BBs, or rifles, so potentially adding an activity to these areas could help keep campers engaged while they wait.

I can't really say they seem to enjoy most of the activities that I went to there were definitely some campers that were diss interested in Activities such as crafts but eventually they got past it when they actually did the activity

My campers least favorite activities this summer was wild. They did not enjoy this area because of all the hiking, but playing games and having distractions from the idea of walking a long ways can be helpful to motivate their interests in nature.

My campers least favorite activities were crafts and alchemy. My campers just weren't engaged or very interested in these areas and instead wanted to be playing outside.

Honestly I did not hear many complaints from campers. The only one that was slightly mentioned was to have some more activities, when there are 4th of July festivals and such, for the older campers to participate in. Specifically for them.

Rifles, Sports. Pre-teen and teen girls that I interacted with either loved these areas or despised them.

BBs- after going once most of them are over it Crafts and wild- if the kids aren't engaged

My campers didn't love BBs, often because it was a lot of unstructured time and there was not a lot for them to do when they weren't shooting.

The only time i got complaints about an activity at camp was a special activity. It was some sort of discussion based special activity and the issue with it was that, although not originally intended to to so, the discussion got to be very political to the point people were expressing their own personal views and deeming others' as wrong.

Very few of my girls liked rifles because they didn't like the idea of shooting a gun. Or they wanted to swim but we're self conscious.

Any comments or suggestions to help improve scheduled activities or the camper program in general?

For American Heritage having amulets in bracelets didn't make a lot of sense, because the campers were only using markers or sharpies to make the amulets. Having campers do amulets in crafts worked well, and also centrilized the activity because bracelets is far from all other activities, too close to crew and too close to the end of santa clara for campers to be there.

I think we needed more special activities this summer, but that falls on the counselors. I think we should have a binder, like the one for counsel fire skits, of all the successful special activities that counselors have run in the past, so it's a little easier for us when we're exhausted and brain dead during KH2 and WF.

I think it might be nice to have a five minute passing period between periods particularly for junior/middlers because if counselors don't have watches it can be difficult to get to and from activities on time. I would also LOVE for their to be more open space trips each week. Open space trips were one of my favorite parts of being a camper, and all of my campers really enjoyed them too. Maybe doing one open space trip for the oldest middlers - introducing them to the experience before they are seniors. Also please can we find another place for emulates? It's a bit unfair to deem shield too sacred for it but somehow bracelets isn't? It also makes the head of bracelets job more difficult to finish staff bracelets before campers arrive.

Encourage programming for special themes and days for the run of the mill areas, gets campers far more motivated to show up, participate, and thrive if a real unique plan is thought out combined with a memorable announcement.

I can't think of anything to improve the scheduled activities or general camper program.

I think that these activities are overall very good, however catchup is a very frustrating time because when an area is open for all age groups it makes it very difficult to be able to mediate everything I've found that the heat can really effect how engaged campers are with programming. I think keeping kids hydrated and integrating cooling mechanisms like water guns and water balloons could probably improve programming. I know that sounds silly and water conservation is important but the heat is a huge reason kids don't get as much out of programming as they could.

Store was given to senior campers way too much. Many times store would be scheduled every single

day of the week for campers to go and get candy. I have no problem with store being open so that campers can buy merch, but I think there should be a distinction between candy store and merch store. If we separated these into two different areas campers can still buy merch during candy store but they cannot get candy during merch store. This would only apply for seniors since juniors and middlers dont go to store as often. This would also cut down on the amount we spend on candy because kids are not taking candy away every single day.

Also trying to make sure that there are staff scheduled to work all of the senior areas, because there were a few days my campers went to 2-3 areas that were listed on their schedules but were actually closed since no one was working them so they wafered a lot.

Have special activities split between the morning and afternoon so not all the general areas are scheduled all at the same time (this is when campers complain about not having anything to do).

The idea of trying to have programming of barn scheduled for seniors worked well. But at times were challenging and had to rearrange peoples schedules. But should continue doing that for the future years.

I think that for older campers especially, there should be more creative special programming. For many older campers that have been to camp for 5-10 years, many of the normal activities can get boring because they have simply done them so many times.

More open space trips!

Donâ€[™]t have BBs and archery back to back for JMs please !!!! They love having fun and different activities like ballistics, bubbles, airplanes etc. Mix it up frequently.

For seniors donâ€[™]t have more than one hike going out at the same time, theyâ€[™]ll be competing with each other

Lots of open space trips and special overnights

Since i was crew lâ€[™]m not exactly sure but i noticed that kids enjoyed the dirty derby and making lip balms at alchemy

Anything that keeps kids active and constantly doing something. The kids (and myself) can get very antsy and distracted when an activity isn't the most engaging.

It may be beneficial to have more options for seniors and more structure in the sense of thought out things to do. I know my girls would get bored if it was just a sit spot.

Do you have any ideas for new activities, areas or programming we should add for next summer?

I think there definitely needs to be more special programming in general next summer. The days seemed to repeat itself and a lot of my campers got sick of the same areas being open every day. I would also say more special programming for J/Ms, because they get jealous of what the seniors get to do.

I always think that there should be more open space trips, while it is limiting because it depends on how many 21 year old staff members there are. Doing trips to the botanic gardens, museums, and other trips that aren't just hikes. Opens up more chances for both out of state kids to see more of Colorado and for campers who aren't super big into hiking. Doing area themed overnights like the barn or G-smash overnight are always really great.

Rock Climbing around camp! I don't think it would take much more than some extra training on the parts of the Heads of Ropes and maybe one or two other people. When done correctly, rock climbing is actually an amazingly safe sport that allows kids to connect with nature and the rocks in a very unique way that would be so cool to share with them.

I think that I'd be really cool to have more of a steady cooking program since we have the kitchen in marathon. All of the campers LOVE when we have cooking clinics, so it might be cool to have someone who was head of cooking to run more of those types of clinics.

JM open space trip for G 14 and 15. Finding a way to bring back free programing evening play

What were the favorite evening play activities of your campers? Least Favorite? Any ideas or suggestions to improve evening play? (To jog your memory-- Jurassic Park, Capture the Flag, J/M Magicology Counselor Hunt, Kangaroo Court, Free Play, Square Dancing, Casino Night, The Dance, Movie Night, Council Fire, Banjo Man, Night, Mock Induction & Ladies Court, Island Dancing).

Favorite evening plays for J/Ms was definitely Jurassic Park. Everyone also seems to love the dance, island dancing, night vespers, and the end of session plays/dances. The least favorite for everyone was definitely casino night.

All of my campers loved jurassic park, council fire, knighthood evening plays, island dancing, musical review. Casino night I think can be tricky because it's like carnival but you get a lot less space to do it. Also having Banjo man come to all of the sessions or just on the fourth of july if possible.

The kids I had loved the games like Jurassic Park (shameless plug, woot woot) and Capture the Flag. Induction and Ladies court are always special to the kids. The older and younger kids love the dance, and the 11-13 year olds are kid of hit and miss with it. We need to do better about taking requests from the kids because almost no dance listened to their audience. It doesn't have to be every song, but more than one or two in 3 hours should get through.

My campers enjoyed Jurassic Park by far the most. Let all the seniors who want to participate in Pageant. I know there's so much deep roots in this. And I think it's awesome but it's hard to enjoy when others are left out. TheyIIT have their turn to be left out when they go back to school at homecoming court. Also why do they get a better meal and our on a raised platform for lunch? That's too much. Literally putting one group above another.

What insights can you share about overnights and cookouts?

It is pretty stressful to try and do both in the same night, so maybe we consider doing them on different nights like we used to do.

I loved the new "rule" that nobody should be on alone for the overnight if it can be helped and I think we should keep that for next summer. For the cookout, we don't need as much food as we've been given, It seems wasteful to give so much food since it will have to be thrown out if it's opened.

I think we need to teach a few more people about starting the fires. There was a time or two when like the 10

and 11 year olds would be gone for a game like Jurassic Park, and that's kinda crazy since that's like the most excited age group for those games.

Cookouts and overnights I think worked well this summer! I do think that for the 5th period when the cookout begins, there needs to be two counselors on cabin with junior/middler cabins so that one can take the kids to get ready and the other can start the fire and get everything going.

I think it might be worth bring them back on different nights - makes them more special to the kids.

If itâ€[™]s raining the kids really donâ€[™]t want to do it. Also I had to carry the bucket of food by myself and do everything by myself a lot.

I think doing both activities at the same place makes a lot of sense. Went really smoothly this past summer.

Overnights and cookouts are extremely fun and having them on the same night is doable, especially with the push to make sure counselors aren't left to handle the cookout/overnight alone. However, I remember having the cookout and overnight on separate nights in years past. I realize this was likely changed to maximize time for evening plays, but it might be beneficial to staff and campers alike to place the cookout and overnight on separate nights staff and campers from being too overwhelmed.

I think that the cookout and overnight should be on different nights. At least for juniors and middlers. It was hard to make sure that the Mackenzie girls were prepared and excited when there were a lot of balls in the air. That being said, all of my overnights and cookouts went WONDERFULLY, just would have preferred them to be on separate nights.

I think that there is a huge crunch of time definitely because of the food we had this summer that took quite a bit of time to cook, but also I still think that all J/M and seniors having overnights on the same night works a bit better so kids aren't missing some evening plays that they would really like to be at, and having the old/young split worked well as the evening play missed would be something the group didn't want to be at anyway.

I thought they went really well, except my campers were all unhappy eating hot dogs.

I think if you separate the cookout and overnight it could run a lot smoother. How I imagine this working is that on one night half the juniors/middlers do their cookout and the other half do the overnight. The overnight group would eat in the lodge a regular dinner and then leave right after dinner. The cookout group would do their cookout and then head to evening play afterwords. This eliminates the late starting time for some groups to leave to their overnight spot because they know exactly when their meal will end and can leave by 7:30 every time. If it cant be scheduled to pack during the afternoon kids can always pack during rest hour which wouldn't be bad because it tires them out for the overnight and can get to bed a little earlier maybe. The cookout group can stick to the counselors on dorm/cabin starting the fire and they don't have to worry about their kids packing giving them more time to start the fire for cookouts during 5th period. Kind of tough to hike up right after the cookout, especially on a stomach full of beans and hot dogs. Cookouts with the gas grill and the aluminum foil and coals were the more efficient.

They should be on different nights, or if they are not on different nights the counselors should have more help with getting the food up there and taking the trash down, often times we are putting the overnights at places such as vespers hill or ropes, this is where we have to carry up or stuff, then grab the food and get that all set up, in many cases then have to go the opposite way from our overnight location, to dispose of the waste, this has added around 30 to 45 unnecessary minuets to our overnight process, when it would only take maybe a two minuet gator up to those areas. This would really help with the J/Ms cause it is already tough enough to encourage them to hike and get going, but while they keep on having to wait it just gives them more time to get discouraged or bored.

I think that they went well mostly, some times there needed to be communication a lot of time when going on the overnight/cookout there was very little communication.

I like how we changed the overnight culture so that everyone is on! I think it makes overnights more enjoyable for the counselors and the campers. Also, one time I think the oldest middlers were scheduled for their overnight on Jurassic Park and that was absolute anarchy, so maybe avoid that?

It was very helpful to put more pressure on staff to stay for overnights so that we had more staffing/coverage!

I never went to Mini but the ones that I wore on camper seem to really enjoy I would advise the staff and Campus should tell more stories during those events it works pretty well

Have the food be driven up and with proper equipment (foil and tongs) for the cookout. There should be at least 2 counselors from each cabin and dorm on for the overnight as well.

The more counselors that can be on, the better. Having more counselors there really helps with supervision and getting everything done, as people aren't trying to do all of the setup and supervise at the same time. They shouldn't be on the same night, it is way too much for staff to get all the kids packed and get the cookout started and then finish in time to hike out. More variation with overnights, even though the shrine isn't far kids love it. Or even Vespers Hill.

Beans in a can are difficult, hotdogs are much easier over regular fire than charcoal.

It always felt like a rush to figure out where your group was if you were running an area that afternoon. Also hectic if it's your night off and you were with the kids in the afternoon

I thought that the timing was really tight especially with a farther away location, it felt rushed to get from one activity to the next. I think that during world friendship where we attempted to not have anybody on alone on the overnight was very helpful, but it could be better scheduled and staff could have more of an awareness when taking their nights off.

The hotdogs for the cookouts I believe were easier to cook than pizzas

I think that they should all be done at the same time rather than spread out over the course of the two weeks. Doing this would allow special activities such as extra overnights more freedom to be implemented.

Comments about the new stuff/changes in 2019?

I thought the new stuff all went great!!

I loved all of the new changes this year!

I really liked the change from CIT to first year counselor. Last year I got questions about whether or not I actually was a counselor from parents, friends, and even a couple new campers, and there were some counselors last year that could've benefitted from this program change, and you could see the impact it had on some of the new counselors this year, which was amazing.

I think the removal of CIT was great! I wasn't on staff for when the position was still present, but I think there is a lot of problems with age hierarchy at camp and removing the CIT position helps with that. The new barn is amazing, nothing more to say about that. The Olympics schedule this summer made it pretty easy as a counselor to figure out when games needed to happen!

New counselor development makes a lot more sense and seems to be a great thing that integrates all of counseling staff rather than isolating the 18 year old counselors in any way. Really worked.

Store while profitable, seemed a little too frequent which resulted in not a lot of food at points in the session. The socio-economic capital aspect that was naturally formed with preloaded accounts was definitely not a positive thing for campers and the concept of summer camp as well. Not proven to be very negative either but I can say it was not entirely beneficial.

I loved the New Counselor Development program. I felt like I had a strong support system if I needed help with my first summer as a counselor, but I also still felt equal to the more veteran counselors, which was a spectacular balance. I'm divided on the new store; I think having the new merchandise is awesome, but it was definitely a strange dynamic to have kids with varying amounts of money in their accounts, as they were definitely inclined to discuss their balances with each other. The mailroom was extremely convenient. The mailroom made doing mail much easier for us on dish krew since everything was in one place. I can't speak for the counselors, but it was very helpful and simplified our job.

Store should be separated into two areas, merch store and candy store. See "Any comments or suggestions to help improve scheduled activities or the camper program in general?". Olympics went great. Actually getting through lots of games was fun and engaging to kids. My kids were excited to be able to play so many games. The mail room worked great for me and I don't miss it being at the end of tables.

The mail room and locker rooms were great in my opinion! It would still be helpful to find a way to limit the amount of store staff takes, (maybe being more intentional about who works store and not letting them take food at all?) but everyone seemed to love all the new merchandise.

The store program should be done more anonymous so that kids don't brag about how much money they have in their account. Also, campers should not be allowed to buy more candy using their account money when store is scheduled.

New barn was pretty nice. CB went really well. The dinner part was a little off schedule but the counsel ring idea was very good. My only thing is what if it rains?

I thought the removal of the CIT program was a positive change, I liked how everyone was treated as a counselor instead of as a specific job. The new barn and mailroom both worked really well. I didn't like the addition of the new store system. It made kids who didn't have money feel very left out and made social groups focused on money. While the merchandise was great, my younger campers often bought things that they never used, and seemed to be spending money just to spend the money in their account. It was also difficult to encourage positive spending habits as the campers were free to spend their money however they liked. I think that there should definitely be a cap on how much money a kids should be able to have in their account. Although it may make more money for camp, it is not good for younger campers to have \$100+ in their account.

I think the counselor development program was great but I think there should've been more supports in place. Meetings with all of them, more structured and unstructured check ins, evaluations that leave them feeling good. I was hesitant about CB but I thought it went really well! No more CIT- good :)

Mailroom-good but sometimes mail gets forgotten for days

CB- I liked that it was in the council ring and that you could see everyone, I think there should be more funny skits and references to the summer.

Store-not a huge fan, doesnâ€[™]t feel like it aligns with the camp values. I think it could be good for the use of buying essentials like toothpaste and stamps etc and maybe an emergency jacket if you forgot one. This summer it mostly seemed as if parents felt obliged to put in money so their kids could have it to spend like the other kids, and they would end up spending all the money on things they donâ€[™]t really need just because they had it. I think it should just be open on checkins and outs. Creates complicated situations w young kids who donâ€[™]t have money.

Removal of the title CIT helped my summer a lot. Going into the summer I was worried about not being respected as a counselor and had heard some horror stories from older staff about your first year on hill, but was pleasantly surprised. The counselor development program seemed good, I think it might have been helpful if there was time especially during myths and american heritage where all of the new counselors could meet and talk about insecurities and problems, there were moments where I felt I was super alone in my transition into being a counselor that could have been fixed by getting to talk to my peers in a way that was not as structured as some of the meetings during orientation.

Counselor development: Needs more approachable people.

Teen Leadership Program: GREAT job but I feel like it still needs something bec. as an area head, it was so hard to figure out what to do with them.

TRAINEE Program: Goooood as always.

See my Area Head eval for counselor development notes, I think that the trainee and teen leadership programs went great!

I think that the counselor development program is a wonderful new program, but it still has some kinks that need to be worked out. I think that there could have been more time in the beginning of the summer for new counselors to have a discussion about anxieties and problems. Especially doing this with smaller groups and make it less structured. It would have helped me a lot to know that I wasn't alone in my troubles

The trainee program is a great way to help train future staff members and give them experience. I think that there should be a little more structure to when trainees are with their kids, or maybe having them learn how to do special events, like the cookout for example, so that they spend time with their kids beyond just areas and meals. The teen leadership and counselor development programs were great this summer, I don't think any changes need to be made.

The trainee program had some bumps this year but I think it was a learning summer that can be applied for the future, Especially with camper staff line. Teen leadership is still getting its footing but I think if there were more structure for the area heads it will be really helpful.

All of these programs were very strong this summer.

All-around great job by the team.

I think they are all great programs! I especially like Teen Leadership because I think it gives campers who aren't trainees a chance to learn more about camp and have responsibilities.

I like the CIT program being gone. Not a huge fan of the trainee program.

I think the Counselor Development program was AMAZING, after being one of the last CITS which was one of the more frustrating programs this allowed for new counselors to have someone to ask for help while not being looked at as in a lower position then other counselors.

I think the trainee program works it just has struggles when a weaker group like this years comes in and has just a few large things that go on.`

No complaints in any of these areas. I felt prepared to do my job everyday and the counselor development program helped greatly.

I don't think I have enough connection to the trainee program to speak about it. The Teen Leadership program is wonderful in that it allows senior campers to have a measurable impact on camp that they can recognize. The Counselor Development program might be the most beneficial change I saw at camp this year. I felt so prepared for my first summer counseling due to the Counselor Development program and confident that I was contributing to staff despite it being my first year as a counselor. I never experienced being a CIT, but I agree with the sentiment that it created an unnecessary rift between CITs and counselors, so the New Counselors program was great for mending that.

Trainee program was strong and effective for this small group of kids. I had the trainee boys in WF and they seemed like almost entirely different people (confidence wise) than when they first walked into the lodge during myths

I loved how much of a large presence the Teen Leadership Program had this summer. I think that teen leaders

should be just as important as the trainees and I think they did a great job making sure that happened this summer. I liked that the trainees didn't get their gifts on the final morning and that it was only the teen leaders. I didn't really feel like there was a counselor development program as a new counselor this summer. While I don't think these programs are perfect, I can't specifically say what needs to be improved in them.

I think Oliver did great things with the Teen Leadership Program, and I think we should do more for Teen leaders because it helps balance the Trainees' (who are great don't get me wrong) ENORMOUS egos. I think counselor development did great this summer from what I could see.

Teen Leadership is great but I found it hard to find the time to implement a meaning full program since we are counseling or working areas and cant just leave to teach teen leaders how to do our areas.

Suggestions for or comments on dish crew / work crew, or other off-hill personnel:





Creating a program activity intentionally




Elements

- Indicators: Specific, observable characteristics (Evidence)
- Outcomes: See above

Outcomes Design Cheat Formula

"To Statement" + Outcome Battery Element + Activity = Outcome

These are good words to use in your Outcomes! Example Outcome: "To Increase Perceived Confidence by learning how to shoot a BB gun."

Activity Planning

Designing the Activity

- How does the activity accomplish your outcome?
- Is the activity designed for the age characteristics and developmental needs of the children?
- Is your staff trained properly to conduct this activity?
- Will your activity "include" everyone?

Explain

- Explain it (verbal)
- Forecast the experience (what you'll "do")
- Show it (demonstrations)
- Test it (hands on practice before they "start")
- Set some goals (how will it challenge campers appropriately)

Participate (Doing the Activity)

- Reinforce the positive stuff (go back to your explanation stuff)
- Critique (technique based...use those counseling skills!)
- Repetition
- "I can do it myself!"...but you can help if I need it (develops self-esteem)

Processing (Debrief)

- Ask Questions (what did you do, what did you learn, now what)
- Let the kids lead
- Highlight the key points (go back to your explanation)
